### Infrastructure Committees

## ***Opening Work Party***

Saturday, April 14<sup>th</sup>, 9 AM

Prepare for the opening of the sailing season.

There are three major projects areas for the work party:

- **Docks and launch area:** The docks have many problems and some of these problems require immediate attention: tying some docks to pilings, re-joining two of the floating docks, and removing weeds, plants, etc., from the docks and also putting up the diving board and getting the swim area ready for the summer. Tools needed: gloves, small tools for working between dock crevices to remove weeds. It will take four to six people to work on the docks. David Laird is chairing this task and his contact information is 756-7164 or [davelaird@charter.net](mailto:davelaird@charter.net)
- **Common grounds:** Clean up the debris left over when the power company cut down a tree that had blown down in a storm at the 1<sup>st</sup> hairpin turn on the access road, and bring the remaining fire wood down to the club house. In addition, the brush needs to be trimmed back on the access road so that vehicles are not damaged as they drive on the access road. Tools needed are gloves, a pickup truck, heavy-duty shears for trimming brush. Two to three people should be able to complete these tasks in a couple of hours. - **Clubhouse and decks:** Power wash, sweep, clean-up, walkways, club house decks, asphalt roadway from club down to launch. Four to six people are needed. Tools required: brooms (at the club), two power washers, hoses to hook up to power washers, rakes (at the club), wheel barrows to move trash to burn pile at launch area or a pickup truck. 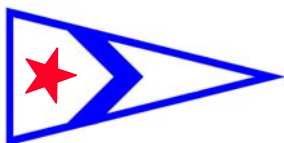
