Board Notes

May 2, 2007

Infrastructure Committees

MOORINGS & DOCKS: (David Laird) Please be careful walking on the docks. The rubbers between dock sections will be nailed down on both sides.

ROADS & GROUNDS: (Richard Rudder) Please rip out any ivy growing on trees.

INFRASTRUCTURE SYSTEMS (Rob Schab): Steve Kridelbaugh proposes a standing committee to develop a plan for repairing and or replacing portions of the water distribution system this summer. Steve will chair the committee. First priority will be to hire location and marking services for the present system. Steve presented a proposal of committee and work plan.

WORK PARTY (Sean Randle) May 19th at 9 AM. The focus will be:

- clearing small 2-4 inch Alder between trailers on low level and the Upper Crust and between the trailers and boat ramp road on the lower level. Bring your chain saw and wheel barrows.
- work on the docks if the right fixtures can be obtained by the 19th. The outer most docks have to be tied to the pilings and not just to the "brow logs", however, we have to find the right fixtures before this work can proceed. Call David Laird to see if you can help.
- two to three people will be working on fixing the roof of the club house around the chimney, again, the right materials have to be acquired. Thad Vincent and Sean Randle are leading the work on the club house roof.

The Portsmouth Yardstick

Each year the United States Sailing Association tabulates the North American Portsmouth Yardstick Table of handicap numbers. The Portsmouth Yardstick is a widely used method of rating boats of different classes sailing the same courses. It is a time-on-time handicapping system and is derived from actual records of classes of boats with thoroughly documented ratings. Portsmouth Numbers are defined as the length of time boats would take to sail a common but unspecified distance. For full details, go online at www.ussailing.org/portsmouth

Use the following chart to compare actual racing elapsed time and the resulting time corrected for the boat's handicap. CBYC used the Portsmouth numbers as a basic for determining the handicap numbers used for our racing series. The formula for calculation of adjusted or corrected time is

$$\text{Adjusted / Corrected Time} = \frac{\text{Elapsed Time}}{\text{Handicap Number}} \times 100$$

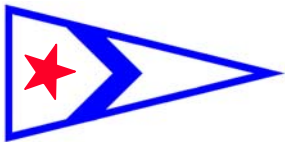
