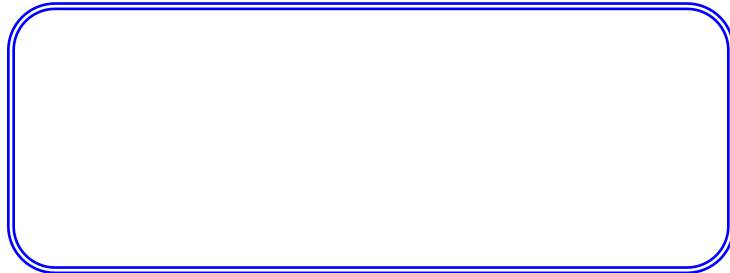

New Member Social

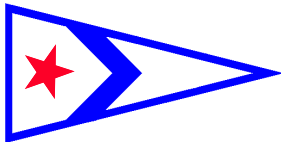
- When:** September 24, 2011 6pm the event will be at CBYC clubhouse. There is no cost to attend.

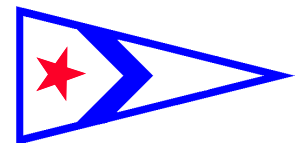

Geary 18 International Sailing Championships

Tim Mills of Portland, OR with crew Lisa Dickover of Roseburg, OR won the 2011 Geary 18 Internationals held at Tenmile Lake, Oregon on September 2nd through 4th. The winds were survival conditions on the first day with gusts up to about 30 knots and the next few days were a mixture of light to medium winds. Tim showed his ability in high winds with two 1st places during the first day and sailed very consistently on the following days. Sean Randle with crew Jessica Randle from North Bend took 2nd place with a 3rd place from Canadians Michael and Michelle Rodde. 4th place went to Oscar Barney and crew 1st day Tristan Gates and a friend from Portland on the following days. 5th place went to Thad Vincent with crew Bernadine Vincent of Lakeside.

Garth showed his sailing ability in the very high winds of Friday and continued to sail well throughout the series. This long time sailing series with its own perpetual trophy, began in 1966, and was named after Fred Harley who along with Ted Geary founded the Geary 18 Association. These races are held simultaneously with the Internationals and the winner will move on to participate in the International Championships in the following year.

Next July there is a possibility of the Laser fleet going to Lake Arrowhead at the same time as the Geary 18s. More news about that later. It gives the fleet a year to contact Laser sailors in Southern California who want to sail with our "mighty fleet".
