




Fire Regulations are in Effect by Coos Forest Protection Association (CFPA):

CBYC is classified as a "hosted site", meaning we live there. Under current regulations a **"warming fire" (small camp fire size) is permitted in the point fire ring.** Also required a "responsible human" must be present and extinguish the fire at the end of each use. Water and tools must be available. <u>No brush debris may be burned until after the fire season is over</u>, expected in November. CFPA prohibits smoking in "all areas except in vehicles on improved roads, in boats, and other designated areas". CFPA rules will become more severe as the summer progresses; when listed as "Extreme", no fires at the point are permitted. <u>CFPA prohibits the use</u> of fireworks at all times.

CBYC policy prohibits use of any liquid fuels (starter fluids) anywhere. Personal use propane BBQ units are permissible when used over non-combustible surfaces. There are two large fire extinguishers at the point storeroom. The clubhouse "salmon BBQ" pit use is for club events. **CBYC policy is fireworks must be used on the docks adjacent to the diving board as "over water".**





US Coast Guard Auxiliary offers a Boating Class

The US Coast Guard Auxiliary will conduct an 8 hour boating safety education course monthly in Charleston. The course covers the basics of boating safety, required equipment, rules of the road, and Oregon boating laws. A test at the end of the course will qualify boaters for their Boater Education Card, under the Oregon Mandatory Boater Education Program. The Boater Education Card is required for all motorboat operators of all ages for boats over ten horsepower. Additional provisions apply to youths. The Class is taught by certified US Coast Guard Auxiliary and Oregon State Marine Board instructors. The cost of the course and materials is \$15.

Pre-registration is required.

Note: You need the Mandatory Boaters Safety Education Card to drive the Safety Boat.

Safety Boat – The motor is to be stored in the <u>raised position</u>.

Point Facility – The store room between the restrooms is for club use, supplies, race committee, and the security camera recording equipment. All personal use for sails, masts, and water toys are to be stored in the clubhouse basement or your trailer site.

Security Report:

The storeroom between the restrooms at the point <u>must be maintained secure by</u> <u>locking both door locks – this is the Race Committee duty at the end of the regular</u> <u>Sunday races.</u>

The gate security and lock usage has been a continuing problem. The gate is to be locked at all times coming and going. Meet your guests at the gate. The club lock goes on TOP! The gate may be left open for club events only by permission of the Commodore. At that time the entire pin and locks will be removed. Members could expect the gate to be locked at the end of the event. Since the "major theft" the gate has been left open, a key was found on the gate shelf, the lock and pin removed and locked with the gate open, the lock placed in the wrong location and in addition more that a dozen "unlocked situations" reported of our facility!

CBYC gate lock (has red tape) on the TOP. To open, press against the gate and remove the lock and catch the pin. To re lock, close the gate, insert the wire to the bottom of the hole, hook onto the pin, raise the pin to the top, press against the gate to hold the pin in place and replace the lock.

Security cameras are being studied and not yet in place.



The **Coos County Marine Deputies** toured our facility and offered suggestions to improve our security. They were each provided a key, our schedule, and encouraged to visit our facility ashore anytime. Please make them feel welcome as we establish a liaison to help us year round and especially mid-week and in the off season. They are Jon Holder, Justin Clayburn and Will Coleman. Please give them a full wave when you see them on the water- their boat is a little "stealthy looking" when seen from a distance however you won't mistake it if you see the blue lights on. They operate several types of boats and keep one in the boathouse next to the county ramp during the summer. They wanted to know how to identify members - the answer is adult member will have a key just like theirs, and will have a membership card. Please keep you membership card in your vehicle or wallet, especially in the off season. They were informed any boat at our docks after November 1 is cause for further investigation.


